Membership

Alan Poulter, representing CILIP, resigned from the committee in September. Pending appointment of a new representative, Gordon Dunsire kindly substituted for Alan at short notice and represented CILIP at the JSC meeting in Glasgow.

Deirdre Kiorgaard resigned from the committee, having served as ACOC representative for 6 years, for 3 of which she chaired JSC through the drafting of the RDA text. Deirdre was succeeded as ACOC representative by Kevin Marsh, who joined JSC in November.

In the course of the meeting JSC met with representatives of the ISSN Network and ISBD Review Group. The meeting was also attended by Kevin Marsh, the incoming ACOC representative and Christine Frodl, whose term as representative of the Deutsche Nationalbibliothek begins in January 2012.

RDA Development

JSC continued to work with the co-publisher and IMT to address outstanding issues with the text, including user reported corrections.

The following proposals were received from JSC constituencies and the broader RDA community, and discussed at the November meeting. Policies and Procedures

JSC reviewed and revised documents setting out policy and procedures. The revisions reflect the transition from development of a new standard the maintenance and development of an established standard and are subject to approval by CoP. Two specific proposals are worthy of specific notice:

- a fast track process to enable contentious amendments and revisions of RDA to bypass the full constituency review.
- a formal process by which the JSC Chair is appointed and succession is planned

Implementation

Constituencies are awaiting the outcome of US RDA Test before committing to timeframes for implementation.

Toolkit Development

JSC members and constituencies contributed to the development of the RDA Toolkit by testing and reviewing functionality.

Outreach

DCMI/RDA Task Group

The first tranche of (11) RDA vocabularies was published as linked open data on the RDA Registry on 1st August.

A telephone conference between JSC and Open Metadata Registry was held on 15th June (16th in Australia).

Harmonization of ISBD, ISSN and RDA

Representatives of all three standards met in Glasgow to discuss issue identified as potential barriers to interoperability. Progress was made towards resolution of the issues and actions were agreed to improve mutual understanding. There was also agreement to continue working together to enable functional interoperability between the standards.

EURIG

The European RDA Interest Group was formally launched at WLIC in Copenhagen and the inaugural members' meeting was hosted in Frankfurt by DNB. Alan Danskin (British Library) was elected to Chair the Executive Committee, providing a strong link between EURIG and JSC. A technical meeting is scheduled for January 2012 to discuss issues raised in the report RDA in Europe: Report of the work in progress in France; proposal for a EURIG technical meeting in Paris...
